

What you need to file for UI benefits:

- Your Social Security Number or Alien Number & expiration date (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Work history from the past two years, including:
- o Employer information (e.g., W-2 or pay stub)
- o Total wages
- o Employment dates
- o Pay rate
- Information about why your job ended
- If you get separation pay or retirement income

You will need additional documents if you are:

- A former federal employee
- Former military personnel
- Applying for Disaster
 Unemployment Insurance

Remember:

- UI benefits provide temporary financial assistance to people who qualify.
- Each person who collects UI benefits is legally responsible for making sure they follow the rules set by state law.
- If you report false or inaccurate information on purpose to get UI benefits, you are committing UI fraud, which can lead to serious consequences.

To be eligible for unemployment benefits, you must:

- Have lost your job through no fault of your own, such as in event of a layoff.
- Have earned enough wages in the last 15 months.
- Be able and available to work.
- Actively look for a new job.

Your Guide to Unemployment Insurance Benefits in North Carolina How to file for Unemployment Insurance (UI) Benefits with the N.C. Division of Employment Security (DES)

You can start **today** by following these steps:



File a claim

Apply through MyNCUI Benefits online at des.nc.gov – this is the fastest way to apply for UI benefits. You can also apply over the phone: 888-737-0259.

After you submit your claim, DES will:

- Review your application.
- Contact your previous employer.
- Review how much money you made from past jobs.
- Let you know how much you may be eligible for based on your past wages.
- Determine if you get benefits based on the reason you lost your job.



Register to look for a job through NCWorks

Register or reactivate your NCWorks.gov account to look for work.

 NCWorks is the state entity that provides career services to people looking for a job. It is a separate organization from the N.C. Division of Employment Security.

3 Look for a job

Starting the week you file, you must contact at least three employers for a job every week.

- One of those contacts can instead be a reemployment activity like attending a job fair, resume workshop, or interview prep through NCWorks.
- Keep a record of what you do to look for work, this is called a "work search contact."



You must file a weekly certification through MyNCUIBenefits each week regardless if you qualify for UI benefits or are waiting for a final decision to be made on your ability to get benefits. This is where you share with us any changes in your employment, wages, and work search each week.

Important!

- Be sure to start filing your weekly certification every Sunday after you file your initial claim. You must file weekly certifications to start getting UI benefits.
- DES may reach out to you with questions about your claim. It is important to respond quickly as this may affect your UI benefits.
