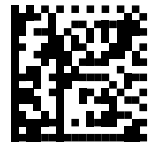

RECOVERY OF OVERPAYMENT

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 96-18(g)(3), the Division may recover amounts overpaid by one or more of the following procedures:

Benefit Offset

The overpayment may be deducted from any future benefits payable to you. A maximum of 50 percent of your weekly benefit amount may be deducted until the overpayment has been satisfied or until you entitlement has been exhausted, whichever comes first.

Tax Offset

The Division may collect through Federal Tax Refunds, State Tax Refunds or Lottery Winnings.

WAIVER OF OVERPAYMENT

Upon a finding of good cause, DES may forgive, in whole or in part, any overpayment that is determined to be non-fraudulent. You may submit a petition requesting a waiver of this overpayment only once. Your request must be in writing and must state the ground(s) and be accompanied by all evidence or documents supporting your request. A petition will not be considered by DES while the decision that caused the overpayment is under appeal. The right to file an appeal is relinquished when a waiver is requested.
