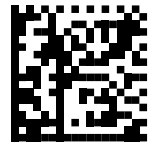

Request for DOR Appeal Denial

Dear JOHN DOE suffix,

You were recently notified that as a result of your failure to respond to the Notice of Overpayment of unemployment insurance benefits that was sent to you, the North Carolina Department of Commerce - Division of Employment Security (Division) intended to apply, \$634.60 of your state income tax refund that had been intercepted by the North Carolina Department of Revenue (NCDOR) towards this debt. You contested this by filing a written appeal to the Division of Employment Security - Benefits Payment Control Unit.

The Division has reviewed your appeal, and has determined that both the overpayment amount and the identity of the debtor are correct. As a result, on February 12, 2017, the Division applied your state income tax towards the debt owed. The remaining balance is \$256.54. To avoid future interception of your state income tax refund, you must request to enter into an Installment Payment Agreement. Any request to enter into such an agreement must be received by February 22, 2017.
